

General Bipin Rawat was the first CDS of India who was killed in an IAF chopper Mi-17V5 crash on 8 December 2021 in Tamil Nadu's Coonoor, along with his wife Madhulika Rawat and staff. 13 out of the 14 members aboard the chopper have been declared dead. The Indian Army has positively identified CDS Rawat, his wife, and Brig Lidder who were laid to rest on 10 December 2021. The remaining 10 bodies will be kept in the mortuary of the Army Base Hospital till positive identification is completed. A tri-service inquiry led by Air Chief Marshal Manavendra Singh has been ordered into the case and the black box has been retrieved. Chief of Defense General Bipin Rawat was born in Uttarakhand. His Father, Laxman Singh Rawat, served the Indian Army and served on the degree of lieutenant general. His mother was the daughter of an ex-MLA from Uttrakhand's Uttarkashi. General Bipin Rawat and his wife Madhulika Rawat survived two girls named Kritika Rawat and again.

He received his formal education at Cambrian Hall School in Dehradun and St. Edward's School in Shimla and later joined the National Defense Academy, Khadakwasla, and the Indian Military Academy, Dehradun, where he was honored with the Sword Honorary. He also graduated from Defense Services Staff College (DSSC), Wellington, and the Senior Command Course of the United States Army Staff and Command College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. It also wore an M.Phil. Degree in Defense Science and Diploma in Administration and Computer Science
